MANUFACTURING

This Reference Product comes from sites that have received ISO14001 certification.



DISTRIBUTION

Products are distributed from logistics centers located to optimize transport efficiency. The Reference Product is therefore transported over an average distance of 2175 miles [3500km] by truck from our warehouse to the local point of distribution into the market in North America.


